Record-breaking attendance at PotatoEurope 2024

A new record has been set. More than 18,000 participants attended the 2024 edition of the PotatoEurope agricultural trade show, organized in Villers-Saint-Christophe (02) by ARVALIS and its partners. On September 11 and 12, 2024, the PotatoEurope 2024 agricultural trade show was held in Villers-Saint-Christophe in the Hauts-de-France region.
